

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#### Bayou Cane Fire Protection District 2019 Budget Message

Date: December 10, 2018

**Honorable Commissioners:** 

I am pleased to submit a balanced, fiscally conservative proposed budget for **FY2019** for the Bayou Cane Fire Protection District for your review, comment, and action. The proposed 2019 budget is **\$4,893,401.75** and represents an **\$98,461.59** decrease, **2%**, from the adopted **2018** budget of **\$4,991,863.34** with an estimated fund balance of **\$1,040,286.78** at the end of FY 2019.

#### RESPONSIBILITIES

"It shall be the mission of the Bayou Cane Fire Protection District to preserve life and property, promote public safety and economic growth through leadership, management, and actions. We will focus our efforts on rapid response to emergencies, providing the appropriate interventions and public education."

The Bayou Cane Fire Protection District has a proud history of serving the citizens of central Terrebonne Parish. We currently possess a Public Protection Grading of "Class 3" and we pride ourselves on providing the ultimate in community involvement and customer service.

Besides the traditional "Fire Protection", we provide on scene emergency medical care with nationally registered Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT's). Each of our apparatus is equipped with the proper medical equipment; including Automated External Defibrillators (AED's) and all apparatus are staffed by EMT's.

Our Fire Prevention Bureau provides a level of safety to the citizens in our district by annually inspecting buildings open to the public to ensure that they are up to code and fire safe. In addition, the bureau strives to educate as many of our citizens as possible on the benefits of fire safety.

#### **2018 ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

#### **Administration Division:**

- Continuously worked to further build upon our working relationships with TPCG
  offices, surrounding fire departments within the parish, and connect with the
  community we serve.
- Made significant upgrades to the infrastructure of the department's computer system and telephone system to maximize efficiency and allow us to work smarter.
- Moved computer server over to fire dispatch
- Joint project with Fire Dispatch to integrate the new CAD system and to utilize the new system to improve response times and incident information placing valuable information directly to the tablets in each truck including pre-plan information.
   Implemented new server and CAD as AVL through Fire Dispatch
- Integrate Firehouse Software with the new CAD system to improve incident documentation through FH CAD monitor, moving our FH data base to dispatch for seamless integration with the CAD system.
- Applied for State Farm Grant for Fire Prevention Inflatable House.
- Applying for Walmart Community Grant for Cameras to document fire investigations and help promote social media use.
- Applied for Firehouse Subs and USFA AFG grants.
- Chief Himel taught at the LA Company Officer Leadership Conference in Baton Rouge hosted by LSU-FETI and taught a class at the 2018 LSFA Annual Conference.
- Chief Himel taught his leadership class for the 3 LSU FETI Lead Evaluator Workshops.
- Chief Himel's article on Fire Service Leadership was published by Fire Engineering Magazine in October of this year.

#### **Operations Division:**

- Victim rescue at Canterbury Apartments structure fire.
- Responded to 26 vehicle lock in/outs and successfully unlocked occupied vehicles.
- Began implementing a policy review and change to Incident Command System to allow better/smoother operations and better accountability on emergency Incidents.
- Purchased a rain coat for each member to help protect members during rain storms.
   This saves on any damage to gear or potential injury to personnel by repeatedly wearing wet bunker gear.
- Purchased new equipment including hooks, Halligan Bars, Hose Straps to better operate on fire grounds.
- Continued purchasing second set of bunker gear and replaced damaged/expired gear including helmets.
- Began process to evaluate fire nozzles and hose to ensure we are maximizing performance versus cost for future replacement.
- Established contact with University Hospital's new Emergency Burn Center to better understand post fire burn care as well as provide a network to follow up and maintain communications with family and victims post fire.
- Responded to 22 cardiac arrest year-to-date and re-gained a pulse on scene of 7.
- Responded to 3 Respiratory Arrest. Successfully revived all three by administering Narcan and breathing for the patient until they regained consciousness.
- Responded to 25 calls for Overdose. Administered Narcan on 20 of these calls prior to EMS arrival.

#### **Training Division:**

#### 2018 Training Division Accomplishments and Statistics

"We believe training does not end when you complete your Recruit Academy, but continues until you retire."

- We sent 2 members to Austin, TX for the Lonestar Conference on strategy and tactics.
- We sent to members to Pensacola, FL for Water on the Fire Conference, dealing with streams, nozzles and water flow.
- We sent 6 members to FDIC in Indianapolis, IN for training on various topics
- We sent 2 members to the Fire Rescue International in Dallas, TX.
- We sent 2 members to Bossier City for a course in Critical Incident Stress Debriefing/Diffusing.
- We sent 2 members to Nevada to participate in hazmat training through the department of homeland security.
- Hosted an 8 hr. Hazmat Technician Refresher course to by JESTEC and Terrebonne Parish OEP.
- Hosted a three-day course with On-Scene Training Associates which focused on search and rescue and VEIS.
- Training Division started one initial EMT course and taught two EMT Refreshers and one EMR Refresher.
- Training Division taught approximately 45 people CPR/FA/AED.
- Approximately 28 certifications obtained this year in Fire, Rescue, and Hazmat.
- 2 members obtained their National Registry EMT Certification.

- 5 members obtained their Blue Card Command Training and Certification.
- Approximately 10 car seats were inspected at our facility by our Technicians.
- 2 of our Car Seat Technicians participated in the annual Sonic Car Seat Give-Away where almost 50 car seats were installed, inspected, removed, or recalled.

#### **BCFD** Training Division Goals for 2019

Continue to provide quality in-house training to members.

We also plan to keep working to improve cost saving measures as it relates to training.

We will be exploring different options for conferences and trainings that we haven't previously utilize in efforts to expand our knowledge for continued improvement.

Continue to evaluate and adjust our testing procedures for step-up testing and permanency testing to best capture the skills and knowledge needed for completing a working test period.

Continue to increase the number of Car Seat Technicians throughout the Department.

#### **2019 BCFD GOALS AND OBJECTIVES**

- Provide timely, efficient and quality responses to requests for assistance from the residents of Bayou Cane by maintaining a sufficient number of trained Firefighters/E.M.T. and officers.
- Continue to implement cost saving measures in all aspects of the department's operation.
- Continue saving and planning for the Purchase of a class-A burn building in an effort to achieve a state-of-the-art training facility.
- Devise a long-range budget plan that will address community needs as well as the needs of the department.
- Continue to update the department's IT and computer systems.
- Continue to provide quality in-house training to members while working to improve cost saving measures as it relates to training.
- Continue to assist members as a resource to continue growth in special operations.
- Apply for Fire Act grant from FEMA for portable radios and headsets for apparatus.
- Further promote the department via social media and Fire Prevention Division.
- Apply for Firehouse Subs grant to assist with replacement of hoses and nozzles in the future.
- Research additional and alternative means of funding for the department.
- Work with the District Board of Commissioners as well as community stakeholders and
  partners to devise a funding initiative that will stabilize the current department
  operational expenses, upgrade our training facility, strategically cover the district
  commensurate with its growth, and provide funding for future growth and expansion.

#### **FUNDS:**

The budget contains the General Fund only as we do not anticipate receiving any revenues that would require the creation of a separate fund.

#### **CAPITAL OUTLAY:**

The budget includes funds for 4 categories of capital improvements, see attached.

#### **FUND BALANCE:**

The fund balance will decrease since a carry-over at the end of FY 2018 is needed for FY 2019.

#### **CASH FLOW:**

Since the revenues are sufficient to cover all anticipated expenditures for 2018, the district will continue to operate on a cash basis.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

Every line item and category of the budget was highly scrutinized. With the development of a 10-year capital outlay plan, we will begin to reasonably plan for the future. Due to spending and budgeting practices incorporated in 2013, we were able to adequately replace aging bunker gear, SCBA cylinders, and begin to replace our aging fleet.

Over all we were forced to cut the budget expenses for FY 18 since our two funding propositions did not gain voter approval. We were able to stave off employee layoffs and avoid closing a station due to responsible financial practices that we have in place. Without some form of funding increase, we will not be able to avoid drastic changes in coverage, service, and operations.

We have a top-notch department that I know each of you are extremely proud of. We have diligently worked to repair our fractured relationship with the community and tarnished image. Neither of which would have been possible without the hard work and dedication from our staff that includes probationary firefighters, experienced company officers, seasoned chief officers, qualified and competent division chiefs and YOU.

In summary, the entire department has accomplished unity as a well working team. This is the biggest accomplishment we have been working towards for several years. Our employees come to work with a new sense of pride. Brotherhood has arrived! We have reached this goal with aggressive training, coaching from the administration, and positive reinforcement. This accomplishment is what gives Bayou Cane the professional image that you and our community can be proud of.
